#### **WEEK #12 RECAP**

### "BLACKJACK"

There may not be enough words in the English language to keep finding new ways to describe this team.

But here's one more to add before we run out: Undefeated.

The 88s have accomplished a goal rarely seen before by completing a perfect 21-0 season thanks to a 16-3 win in their final game to take the franchise's first ever championship.

Setting the tone once again in the leadoff spot was Travis going 5/5 with 3 runs scored.

Following his lead were Nikki and Marnie with 3 hits apiece, Josh with 4 hits and 5 RBI and more defensive brilliance, including another Schumer / Marnie double play.

It wasn't all smooth sailing. The game started off with a scare when a baffling missed call at 3B followed by an uncharacteristic missed play in the OF had the 88s down 1-0 early. But then, in the bottom half of the inning, it happened...

The 88s had the bases loaded. While Schumer (on 3B) and Myles (coaching 3B) were hoping for a 2 run flare into right field, Jeff had other ideas. He stepped up to the plate and cracked the first pitch he saw deep to left center field.

With all base runners ready to tag up, they watched the center fielder turn and run towards the warning track.

As the ball landed over the fence feelings of disbelief quickly gave way to an overwhelming sense that something special just happened.

There have only been a handful of truly legendary home runs hit in Canada. First there was the "touch em all Joe" walk off winner in the 1993 World Series. Followed up 22 years later by the Bautista bat flip in the 2015 playoffs. Both were done by home run hitters and neither were done with the bases loaded.

Where does Jeff's grand slam rank? Only time will tell. Some say it was the best all time while others argue it was a close 3rd. Either way, the King of Coventry has added a new C2 jewel to his crown with one of the most exciting hits in 88s history.

After that the game was never really in doubt again as the 88s rolled on for a convincing win. By the time pictures were taken and twisted teas drank, the 88s were sitting comfortably on top of the mountain, as champions.

Even with a balanced effort on offense with every player getting at least 1 hit, what really floats the 88s boat is their defense.

Facing a lineup with a lot of power, it was especially important for the outfield to be up to the task, and that they were. From left to right, Brian, Joce, Travis and Jeff each made 2 or more key outs at important times to keep the 88s on top and the opponent flustered.

The anchor tonight was Marnie at 1B who had a pivotal run saving highlight reel stop, which if not made could have opened up a big Under Construction inning. She also made the guys on the left side of the infield look good a few times by turning some wonky throws into outs.

Speaking of wonky, Sandi used her smarts to keep the opponent hitters off balance most of the night with purposely crappy pitches when they were down 2 strikes. The wise strategy paid off with a couple K's and other weak hits that the defense gobbled up behind her.

When it was all said and done, the 88s came away with a 14-7 victory which puts them into the finals, 1 win away from destiny.

After uncharacteristically failing to score in 3 of the first 6 innings during game 18, the 88s started feeling the pressure after letting the score get to within 3 runs late. "I was on the phone ownership, giving them names of people to cut for next season." Coach said post game.

That's when their bats started to heat up. Schumer's sharp lead off hit was the spark. Josh, Nikki and Jeff's run producing hits fanned the flames and by the time Travis, Joce and Myles came through with RBI doubles, it was a full on 11 run inferno that led to high fives and hugs instead of pink slips.

When the regular season fittingly ended by Sandi recording yet another K on the mound, the 88s found themselves in rare air with what must be one of the few perfect regular seasons Welland has ever seen.

It's a really nice accomplishment but the job is not done. Bring on the playoffs.

Forced to play at 6:15, half the team was not able to attend but thanks to saviors Kristen, Andrew, Kerry and Dani (plus a gracious approval by the Baby Batters) the 88s managed to fill a roster and avoid the forfeit.

It was a big enough contribution for the fill in players to be present but they were also nice enough to bring along some gravy. Most notable was Kristen going 3/4 with a walk + run and Andrew with some vintage niftiness at SS + a bomb triple to LF. For the core 88s, it was Brian continuing his red hot season by going 5/5 + 3 runs + 2 RBI.

Generally though, it was a struggle for the 88s on offence.

Since runs weren't coming like they normally do, Sandi stepped up to lead the 88s by striking out 4 (including their best hitter for a key first out in the final inning) and putting out another 3 at first.

The 88s scored a season low 11 runs but did enough to scrape out a win and extend their win streak to 11.

Next up was a double header two days later...

Game 1 was a classic 88s all you can eat buffet and some players came to feast.

Jeff (6/6 + 2 runs + 3 RBI), Josh (6/6 + 5 runs sort of + 3 RBI) and Myles (5/5 + 2 runs + 3 RBI) all went perfect at the plate to empty the chicken chow mein chafing dishes.

Joce (5/6 + 4 runs + 4 RBI including 2 monster triples) and Kylie R. (4/6 + 3 runs + RBI including a stellar pitching debut) teamed up to destroy the sushi section.

The players who came away with the award for the most glutinous slobs of the night were Nikki with her 4/5 + 2 runs + an all-time high 6 RBI, breaking a record that had stood since 2018 and Brian with his 5/6 + 5 runs + 5 RBI including his first inside the park homerun and his second cycle of the season.

The 88s ran away with it 29-8 before the white napkin was waved. Game 2 saw the 88s get served some tough steak but thanks to persistent chewing and strategic use of BBQ sauce they were able to clean their plates.

Things started well with a nice soup and salad appetizer as Jeff sat down 7 straight to begin his pitching debut while the 88s got off to an early 7-0 lead.

Andrew makes a dazzling scoop, spin and throw to Marnie at 1B for the defensive highlight of the night. He was also involved in an important double play late in game 2 started by Josh on the mound after a come backer.

Injured star John crutched out to show his support during the game 1 feast which may have helped spur the 88s on.

### "A PERFECT 10"

The 88s passed the test.

Playing their first full night without starting short stop John, the 88s didn't waste time before showing how impactful that missing piece might be during a historically bad first inning.

Dealing with a rare deficit in game 1 after letting in 11 early runs, the 88s settled down and found their usual form by stifling their opponent for only 2 runs allowed over the final 5 innings.

Their depth was tested, but the 88s used a balance attack to score high marks and reel off 2 more wins for a perfect 10-0 start to the season, a new franchise record.

Game 1 showed their vulnerability but it also showed their resolve.

Nikki (a.k.a. The Bookie Speed Demon), Travis and Joce each went 4/5 with 3 runs and at least 1 RBI. Brian went 5/5 including the team's first home run out of the park with a 3 run knock in the first. Myles went 4/4 with 3 triples and a joyous inside the park homerun for what may have been his first career opposite field hit. Josh knocked in a personal best 6 RBI.

While game 1 had its stand out performances, game 2 is when the 88s really showed their strength by having every player both score at least 1 run and knock in at least 1 run.

Highlight of the night defensively goes to Kylie D's leaping grab at the apex of 2B to pluck a liner out of the air and save a hit.

# "2 WINS, 2 LOSSES."

The 88s unleashed more of their arsenal this week.

Whether it was Travis using a sniper rifle to fire off a record 8 hits in a game or the team sharing a flamethrower to torch an opponent for a record 49 hits and .790 batting average, the 88s were on the offensive all night.

After the assault on the record book was complete and the dust settled, the 88s found themselves holding a franchise best tying win streak to give themselves the top record in the league and a perfect 8-0 July.

It wasn't all polished steel for the 88s however. Starting short stop and early MVP candidate John went down with what turned out to be a broken foot in the first inning of game 1 while sliding into second base. He's out 6-8 weeks.

In game 2 it was hall of famer Sandi departing with a jammed hand after getting in front of a hard hit ball on the mound. She's listed as day to day.

The depth of the 88s will be tested in the second half of the season as they look to continue their pursuit of the ultimate prize.

### **WEEK #2 RECAP**

"4 AND OH MY!"

The night almost didn't happen. The skies opened up pre game putting the double header in jeopardy. Yet after the clouds took a hike all that was left for the 88s to do was send 2 new opponents packing.

After a forgettable game 1 that the 88s took 11-2 thanks to great all around defense and several stand out batting performances, including Josh's 4/4 + 2 runs + 2 RBI, Joce's 4/4 + run and Kylie D's 3/4 + run + 2 RBI, the 88s headed into game 2 prepared for their toughest test of the young season.

Sparked by a lead off hit by Kylie R. and the next 5 straight batters following her lead, including Brian's bases loaded 2 run double, the 88s put together an epic 8 run 6th to climb all the way out and knot the game up at 14.

After Balls Deep left the door ajar with a 3 up 3 down top of the 7th, the 88s promptly kicked it open with timely hits by Schumer, Nikki and Marnie.

Stepping to the plate with the bases loaded, still tied at 14 was Pope, who blessed the 88s with a clutch 2 run single. Those ended being the winning runs after Balls Deep went quietly again in the final inning by sending 3 harmless hits into the waiting gloves of Travis, Sandi and Joce.

So after Balls Deep tried to steal the 88s home field advantage before the game and then one of their runs off the board before the final inning, it was the 88s who proved to be the better thieves by stealing the game and extending their win streak to 4 straight.

On the mound #8 Sandi Griffi sat down 6 opponents while giving 0 free passes across 2 games. #22 Kylie Douglas was worth the wait during her spring training hold out by putting up an all-time stat line of 5/5 with 5 runs and 5 RBIs in game 2, which all ties franchise records. #97 John Paul Harvey set the tone in game 1 with back to back strong plays at SS. #9 Kylie Rendell put up 7 hits and 4 runs across 2 games. #5-0 Travis Belchior played all over the diamond on defense while still putting up 6 RBIs. Team vet #18 Brian Chandler scored every time he got on base (9/10 with 9 runs) and #10 Jeff Henderson (8/10 with team leading 8 RBI) showed he could also reign outside of Coventry. Nikki and Myles were also in attendance.

Not wanting the story to be too one note, after he sent a rocket to the fence with his previous at bat, Travis decided to add some levity with a high spin dribbler infield hit that came to rest 6 inches in front of home plate.

Also wanting to show they have a vulnerable side, the 88s took an inning off as a team to boot around some errors. Brian also decided to flesh out his career stats by recording his first ever strikeout to join the K club. After they had their fun seeing how the other side lives for a while, they got back to work and finished the game on a 27-2 run.

The bold exclamation point of the night came halfway through game 2 when #6 Joce Hunter sent an absolute bomb to the left field fence for an incredible stand up 2 run triple. That blast

rounded off her all around excellent night on both sides of the ball, playing lock down defense in CF to go along with 6 hits and 6 RBI over 2 games.

By the time their letter reached the league office the following morning the news had already begun to spread throughout the division. The 88s are back. The 88s are stronger, faster and a force to be reckoned with.

#### **2021 SEASON PREVIEW**

After a lost year to a global pandemic, the 88s are coming into the 2021 season looking to catch the winning bug with a retooled roster.

A fresh batch of talented rookies join a group of returning 88 legends to form what feels like a whole new club.

Odds makers have the 88s at 10-1 to win it all, which is the most aggressive prediction placed on the franchise heading into a new season.

They seem to be embracing the pressure. We caught up with an optimistic 88s coach after their latest spring practice.

"Vegas isn't the only one with high expectations for this year's team. We have a ton of good players up and down the lineup. We plan to make some noise."

With a delayed start to the season while waiting on the green light from the government to return to play, the 88s have taken the opportunity to knock off the rust built up during a year on the shelf.

"We've been getting in our swings since May. We've lost more balls this year than ever which has to be a good sign."

Leading the way in the lost ball category was OF Brian Chandler, who trimmed up and added strength in the off season to solidify himself as one of the team's premier power hitters.

Time will tell if the 88s can translate an impressive spring and what they have on paper into a winning campaign over a long summer, but there's no hiding the fact they speak of ambitious goals.

This time of year, hope springs eternal.

The 88s open up their season during the week of July 5th. Tickets remain free but it's recommended to show up at the park early since seating is expected to be limited for social distancing.
